Rainbow Week At Braefoot






Summer is coming We need your books! We have a pink bin inside the library!

Instruction/Curriculum Planning for Next Year

Next Friday, Braefoot Staff will be preparing and planning for next year. The day will be spent investigating Indigenous/First People's Principles of Learning and examining high level assessment tools to support our instructional goal on improving grade level reading skills and strategies.

We are very pleased to be offering 11 Divisions next year. Teacher placements have not been finalized. As in previous years, we will be having a mix of straight grade and combined grade classes.

The placement of students each year is a task our staff takes very seriously. I'd like to share with you the process and criteria that we use at Braefoot when we are setting up classes for the new school year. It is a lengthy, complicated and thorough process, which we believe is essential to create well-balanced classes.

It is important that each class is similarly composed with an equal balance. We strive to balance leadership potential, peer relationships, academic abilities, health concerns, behaviour, languages spoken, number of years the child has been with a teacher, child's maturity, and students with diverse learning needs.

This process provides our students with the most reasonable class sizes and compositions . We strive to set students up for maximum success next year. If you have questions please contact Mr. Thompson directly at 250-477-6948.
