Start Up Packages, Forms and Payment

On Monday, each family was emailed information with a link to "Parent Connect" regarding online permissions (i.e. for field trips, computer use etc.) for their child(ren). This only needs to be done once in a child's time with the Greater Victoria School District.

In addition, each student should have brought home a pack up of paper forms which are not available online. You will need to review, amend, sign and return these papers to your child's teacher as soon as possible.

These documents are critical in assisting our school to contact families in the case of an emergency.

Please return the envelope **directly** to the classroom teacher. Each envelope is personalized and has a handy checklist within the letter for online forms and paper forms.



BRAEFOOT LIBRARY NEWS



We are looking forward to another year of reading, learning, exploring, and creating in our Braefoot Library Learning Commons! This year, all classes will have the opportunity to visit the Learning Commons for library book exchange, lessons in Applied Skills, Design, and Technologies, and various collaborative lessons and activities co-taught by Mrs. Baker and classroom teachers.

Book Exchange

During the week of September 25th, all students will begin visiting the library for regular book exchange. Books are typically due back one week after they are borrowed for Kindergarten through Grade 3 students, and two weeks after they are borrowed for Grades 4-5. However, all students are welcome to renew books if they need more time to finish reading them! Books can also be returned in advance if they are finished early. This year, all divisions will have their book exchange on **Wednesdays**, with the exception of **Division 5** (Miss Linnell's class), who will have their book exchange on **Fridays**.

As you may be aware, on May 31, 2023, the Board of Education ended the School Police Liaison Officer Program which involved School Police Liaison Officers from Oak Bay Police, Saanich, and the RCMP (Police Liaison Officers have not been present in Victoria and Esquimalt schools since 2018).

The Board of Education and the Superintendent of Schools are deeply committed to creating and maintaining safe, welcoming, and inclusive school environments for all members of our learning community. We believe that every student deserves an environment in which they can thrive academically and personally and want to assure you that the safety of our learning community remains our top priority.

Furthermore, we want to reassure you that our students will continue to receive the necessary support and care from trained, certified, and regulated professionals in schools and the community. Over the summer, the Board of Education and the Superintendent of Schools worked to ensure that appropriate processes are in place. We will be collaborating with schools to ensure they are informed about how to access and utilize these available services for supporting students and staff during times of need.

The Board is committed to maintaining strong relationships with local police and to clearly defining their roles within our schools. They play a key role in keeping our school communities safe. In the event of a school emergency, we want to emphasize that our existing protocols for lockdowns, critical incidents, and violent threat risk assessments continue to be in effect.

Thank you for your continued support and dedication to our shared goal of providing a safe and nurturing educational environment for all students.

Dear SD61 Parents/Caregivers:

This letter is being sent to all families in the Greater Victoria School District to provide information about the Indigenous Education Department (IED) and the services and resources this department provides to our SD61 learning community. This letter will clarify the definition of Indigenous Ancestry and explain how to self-identify on the school registration form.

The Indigenous Education Department (IED) supports the inclusion of Indigenous perspectives and resources that align with the BC Curriculum in our schools and classrooms along with providing holistic supports to students that have self-identified with Indigenous Ancestry. The staff of the IED provides guidance in our School District to weave Indigenous Knowledge and Ways of Being into district policies, classrooms and schools. Key areas include: Holistic Wellness; Social Emotional Learning; Land Based Learning; Arts and Culture; Advocacy for Indigenous students and families; and, the authentic use of Indigenous resources for schools and classrooms. The IED works with The Songhees Nation; The Esquimalt Nation; The Metis Nation Greater Victoria; The Urban People's Indigenous Advisory and an Indigenous Elders Advisory Council.

The BC Ministry of Education and Child Care defines Indigenous Ancestry as students who identify as First Nations, Status or Non-status, Métis or Inuit. The BC Ministry of Education and Child Care does not require proof of ancestry to self-identify. Parents and caregivers of students with Indigenous Ancestry may choose to self-identify on the school registration form under the section Indigenous Ancestry or by calling the school to request that they include this self-identification of Indigenous Ancestry on your child's school registration form.

Our Indigenous Education Department provides supports to all schools in the district along with supplementary supports for students who self-identify as having Indigenous Ancestry. The purpose of these enhanced learning experiences is to increase a sense of belonging, academic success and increase understanding and awareness within our School District. The Indigenous Education Department will connect with your family annually about the opportunities that may be available at your school, in the district and/or in the community as it relates to Indigenous Education. Participation in these programs, supports and services is always voluntary.

CEDAR HILL MIDDLE SCHOOL PROJECT REPORT

SCHOOL REPLACEMENT- PROJECT UPDATE 3910 CEDAR HILL ROAD SEPTEMBER 11, 2023



PURPOSE

This project report will update the Cedar Hill community throughout the construction phase of the seismic replacement of Cedar Hill Middle School.

BACKGROUND

The replacement of Cedar Hill Middle School is a priority project for the District due to its high seismic risk and poor general condition. The school is a key asset to meet current and projected enrolment for regular and District educational programs. The new school will be designed to meet today's seismic requirements and support accessibility and next generation learning. The new school will also support carbon reduction through roof-top photovoltaics and a geo-thermal mechanical system.

Cedar Hill Middle School will remain operational during the construction of the new full replacement school on the existing south/east playfield; see new site plan below. Once the new school is complete, and students and staff have moved in, the existing school will be demolished and a geo-thermal field and replacement playfield will be constructed in its place.

The school will take approximately 2 years to complete and will require additional patience and understanding as our busy location will be even busier.

The replacement of Cedar Hill Middle School will provide our community with a progressive new school that will serve our community for future generations.

PROJECT UPDATE

Starting Monday, September 18:

- The General Contractor will begin setting up protective fencing around the build site. The red
 dotted line on the map below indicates fenced area.
- The General Contractor will begin set up of work trailers within the fencing on the Gregory Place and Cedar Hill Road corner of the site.
- There will be large vehicles coming and going on Cedar Hill Road and Gregory Place.
- Student drop-off will remain on Garnet Road and a safe route to the school will be provided
 along the west side of existing sport field #1.
- The Gaga Ball Game will be relocated to a temporary location for the 2023/24 school year.
- The Basketball Court will not be available during construction.
- There will be extra supervision on the playground during site set up.
