How do I let the school know my child will be absent from school?

If your child will be absent from school, please let the school know. You can either **email braefoot@sd61.bc.ca** or call the **attendance line at 250-477-6948** and leave a message. Please tell us the student's full name, division/teacher, reason for the absence (ex. sick, vacation, appointment) and how long the student will be away.

You are welcome to email your child's teacher as well, but it is important to let the office know as we update the student attendance system. If a child is absent and the office has not been notified by a parent, an email and/or phone call will be sent to parents.

Students who arrive late to school, or who are picked up during the day, must sign in on the clipboard on the table outside the office.

Braefoot Winter Concert

The Braefoot Winter Concert is scheduled for **Wednesday, December 13th** at 1:00 and 6:00 pm. Tickets will be \$3.00 each and will be limited to 2 tickets **<u>per family</u>** for each performance (i.e. two tickets for the afternoon and two tickets for the evening) due to fire regulations.

This year we will try using Cash Online for families to reserve their tickets. Tickets will be available through the youngest and/or only child. If extra tickets become available, they will be offered on a first-come first-served basis.

School Cash Online accepts credit card payments or E-check (i.e. for those who do not have a credit card, but who do have a bank account). If you can not reserve tickets online, you will be able to contact the school via email and we will reserve them for you.

We hope this early notice will allow all parents, grandparents and neighbours an opportunity to adjust their schedules. Look for more information in the next newsletter.
