NEW REPORT CARD PROCESS

Dear Parents and Caregivers:

We are writing to share that the report cards you will receive this year will reflect the new Ministry of Education and Child Care reporting order. The Greater Victoria School District has been preparing for these changes and you will likely notice a minimal difference from the previous year.

Some highlights include:

- The use of the Provincial Proficiency Scale from K-9 and letter grades and percentages in grades 10-12
- Descriptive feedback on all report cards from K-12
- Student self-reflection of Core Competencies and goal setting
- Graduation status update for students in grade 10-12 in June

As a district, one change we have made this fall is the way you will receive your child's report card. **Families will access report cards via SD61's Parent Connect on Friday, December 22**nd. Parent Connect is what you may have already used to give your child online permissions (i.e.: Neighbourhood walks, computer use, etc). Please <u>click here</u> to go to Parent Connect.

MOVING ON UP!

ATTENTION GRADE 5 PARENTS

In preparation for Grade 5 transition to Middle School, Grade 5 families will be receiving a letter in mid-January.

The intent of the letter is to:

- 1. Share with families the revised priorities at levelled transitions.
- 2. Communicate where their student will be registered at middle school according to their catchment area.
- 3. Provide a link to more information regarding **English** school pathways located on the School District 61 website at https://www.sd61.bc.ca/registration/school-pathways-transition/ For **Late French**Immersion pathways, please go to: https://www.sd61.bc.ca/registration/late-french-immersion/
- 4. Provide information regarding transfer opportunities.

This is a reminder that Grade 5 students no longer "automatically" follow a pathway, and they will be registered at their catchment schools. The K-12 Student Transfer Process is **Monday, February 12—Friday, February 16 at 3:30 pm.** Please ensure the school office has your correct address. If your address has changed since you signed the verification form which was sent out in September, please let us know asap. The District now requires that you include proof of address. The closure of Late French Immersion at Cedar Hill leaves four sites that still offer Late French Immersion to grade 6 students: Arbutus Global, Central, Lansdowne and Shoreline Middle Schools.

Your first step is to identify your school catchment by using the school locator (found on the website above). Early French Immersion registration (for Kindergarten or Grade 1) is January 15-19 and English Kindergarten registration is January 29—February 2. Before & After School Care Survey

Dear Braefoot Parent/Guardian,

On behalf of the Ministry of Education and Child Care, we are sharing the survey information below to help inform the Province's ChildCareBC initiatives:

We know that many families depend on school-age child care to ensure their children have a quality, affordable, and inclusive place to be during a parent's full work day. That is why the Province's ChildCareBC plan is working to expand access to child care for all families that want and need it.

The Ministry of Education and Child Care is conducting a parent survey to better understand the regional and provincial demand for school age child care.

While we know there is unmet demand for school-aged child care, there is no current provincial or regional data quantifying the demand. Your participation will help the Province plan for future school-aged child care expansions.

This survey is intended for all parents, regardless of the type of child care you currently use or even if you are not using any child care at all.

Who should fill out this survey?

If you have children attending Kindergarten to Grade 7 at a B.C. school, we want to hear from you about your family's child care needs.

What will this survey be used for?

The survey results will be used to support planning for future initiatives under the ChildCareBC plan. All responses are voluntary and anonymous; you and your child will not be identified as a result of your participation in the survey. Information received will be combined and shared with your school and district as a summary.

How do I complete the survey?


Braefoot Christmas Sweater Day Friday December 15

CEDAR HILL MIDDLE SCHOOL PROJECT REPORT

SCHOOL REPLACEMENT- PROJECT UPDATE #3 3910 CEDAR HILL ROAD DECEMBER 7, 2023



As of Thursday, December 7:

- The Ministry Announcement media release of the new school happened on November 27.
- The Ministry sign is now displayed on the fence on Cedar Hill Road.
- The rock-crushing and drilling is almost complete. Site-facing classes worked around the noise in flexible spaces in the school. There has been great teamwork and flexibility inside the school.
- Temporary utilities to school has been completed.
- Daily morning supervision on Gregory Road continues. Thank you for NOT dropping off students on or near Gregory Road. Safety first.
- Students will have winter access to the front north field.
- Photos & videos of the progress on the construction site are taken regularly.

On or after Tuesday, December 7:

- Basketball poles will be put in at the north back of the school.
- Invasive bushes have been removed at the back of the school for student safety.
- The construction may cause additional traffic throughout the day. We would like to emphasize
 the importance of the students who are walking and using the marked cross-walk on Cedar Hill
 Road to take time to:
 - o STOP to press the button for the cross-walk lights to flash
 - WAIT until all cars have come to a complete STOP
 - LOOK BOTH WAYS before crossing
 - WALK BIKES ACROSS the crosswalk
 - o Safety first
