REGISTRATION FOR THE 2024-2025 SCHOOL YEAR

All registration has moved to an online process. Please refer to the following link <u>https://</u> <u>www.sd61.bc.ca/registration/</u> that details all documents that are required and how the online process will work for registration. Click on one of the apps that meet your needs.

Kindergarten Registration App—OPEN JAN 29 to FEB 2



Use this app to complete a registration/transfer request for your child entering English Kindergarten. Registration is currently closed. Kindergarten Registration/ Transfer Week is January 29 to February 2, 2024. Use this app to register your child if they were born in 2019.

Late French Immersion—OPEN JAN 29—FEB 2



Any student entering Grade 6 can enroll in Late French Immersion in the Greater Victoria School District. Registration for Late French Immersion will occur during the week of January 29 - February 2, 2024. Late French Immersion is offered at four dual-track middle schools: Arbutus Global, Central, Lansdowne and Shoreline. No prior knowledge of French is expected or required. If your child is interested in registering for Late French Immersion, please visit our <u>Late French Immersion</u> <u>page</u> for more information about the program, and how to register to be a part of it. Please be sure to watch the five minute introduction to Late French Immersion video and last year's zoom open house meeting. If you still have questions after viewing the video, the open house zoom from 2023 and the Late French Immersion Registration site, please email questions to Sean Powell at spowell@sd61.bc.ca.

To register for the grade 6 Late French Immersion program, please use this app. This app will go live on the morning of January 29 and will be open until 3:00 pm on February 2, 2024. All student placement will be based on district student enrolment priorities. For schools where there are fewer spaces than the number of applicants, a lottery will take place in accordance with student enrolment priorities. If you are wanting your child to attend the Late French Immersion program, and you are willing for your child to attend a school other than your catchment school, please indicate which of the alternate schools your child would attend.

ATTENTION GRADE 5 PARENTS

Grade 5 families have been emailed a letter with information about which Middle School their child will attend next year.

The intent of the letter is to:

- 1. Share with families the revised priorities at levelled transitions.
- 2. Communicate where their student will be registered at middle school according to their catchment area.
- 3. Provide a link to more information regarding **English** school pathways located on the School District 61 website at https://www.sd61.bc.ca/registration/school-pathways-transition/
- 4. Provide information regarding transfer opportunities.

This is a reminder that Grade 5 students no longer "automatically" follow a pathway, and they will be registered at their catchment schools. The K-12 Student Transfer Process is **Monday, February 12—Friday, February 16 at 3:30 pm.** Please ensure the school office has your correct address. If your address has changed since you signed the verification form which was sent out in September, please let us know asap. The District now requires that you include proof of address. The closure of Late French Immersion at Cedar Hill leaves four sites that still offer Late French Immersion to grade 6 students: Arbutus Global, Central, Lansdowne and Shoreline Middle Schools. Grade 5 District Transfer Process—February 12 to 16

Forms must be returned to the Braefoot office by **3:30 pm on Friday, February 16th**.

Important points that you should note about student transfer:

- A) If you would like a form sent home with your student during the week of February 12-16, please email the office at braefoot@sd61.bc.ca.
- *B)* If your desired destination school has space issues, **the choice will be made by lottery**. It is not first come, first served.

- **D)** If you do not have your child's PEN, the office will enter that for you.

LIBRARY UPDATE



Most of our students are doing a wonderful job of remembering to bring their library books back to school in a timely fashion. With that said, January is a great time to look around your house for any overdue library books that may be hiding!

As a reminder, weekly book exchange happens for classes on the following days:

Div. 1, 2, 3 & 4 – Wednesday OR Thursday (alternating weeks)

Div. 5 – Fridays

Div. 6, 7, 8, 9, 10 & 11 – Wednesdays

One way to help set your child up for success and ensure their books are returned so that they can sign out new books each week is to put library books in their backpack the evening before their class book exchange day. As well, students are reminded that they can always ask to renew books if they need more time to finish reading them!

A reminder as well that the library remains open after school until approximately 2:50 on Mondays, Wednesdays, and Fridays. Students are welcome to visit during these times if they have forgotten their books at their regular book exchange time, or would like to exchange their books more frequently!

This inspiring and informative 1.5 hour workshop is facilitated virtually by Kerry Cavers, Founder & President of <u>Moms Against Racism Canada</u>. With compassion and bravery, Kerry invites parents to identify and dismantle racism around them, root out racist biases within them, and actively commit to learning how to raise anti-racist children.

Kerry meets participants where they are in their anti-racism journey, and leads them through a thought-provoking session covering:

- What is Moms Against Racism?
- Kerry's personal story and why she does this work
- Definitions of relevant fundamental concepts
- How to Raise an Anti-Racist Child
 - Anti-Racist Parenting
 - Shift Your Thinking
 - SEEK to be the Change
- Questions & Answers

A worksheet is provided so participants can actively follow along, take notes, capture insights, and document commitments throughout the session. Additional resources are also provided following the workshop.

About your facilitator:



Kerry Cavers (she/her/hers) is an anti-racism advocate, facilitator, and Founder of Moms Against Racism (Canada). She is a biracial, cis-gender woman of African, English, Swedish, and Irish descent who identifies as Black. With immense gratitude, Kerry, her partner, and their 3 kids live as guests on the unceded traditional territories of the Ləkwəŋən people, colonially referred to as Victoria, BC. She created MAR Canada to bring Moms and those in mothering roles together in a mutual aid movement to fight systemic racism together.
