All toys are \$1, \$2 or \$5. Proceeds from the sale will go towards the Grade 5 end of year celebration.






RETIREMENT ANNOUNCEMENT!

Student Led Conferences – will happen in your child's classroom on Thursday, April 25 from 1:00 – 6:00 pm. We will dismiss early at 11:50am. Up to 4 families may book at the same time. Time slots are 15 minutes in length.

Below you will find information on how to book your conference online.

Please follow the steps below to make sure your conference gets booked correctly. If you have any questions please contact the office or your child's teacher.

How to book your Student-Led Conference time online:

1. Copy and paste this link:

https://outlook.office365.com/owa/calendar/BraefootElementarySchool@gvsd61.onmicrosoft.com/bookings/

- 2. Select the date from the calendar for your conference: Thursday, April 25.
- 3. Select your child's classroom teacher (Although the website indicates that it is optional, it is not optional we are unable to change the title the program gave to the section but you must select a teacher to book correctly)
- 4. Select an available conference time for that day with your child's teacher
- 5. Fill in your name, your email address, phone number and your child's name as required
- 6. Check the reminder box that you have selected the correct teacher for your conference
- 7. Click the 'Book' button to complete the process
- 8. You will receive a confirmation email confirming your conference time
- 9. Please note that if you use a phone number from outside B.C. your reminder may reflect that time zone.

You will need to repeat these steps for each of your children

STUDENT PLACEMENTS FOR 2024-2025

Staff and administration will soon be working on the tentative placements of students for next year. If you have any input for us regarding the placement of your child, now is the time to send this in writing to Mr. McCoy at cmccoy@sd61.bc.ca. We will attempt to incorporate your suggestions in our plans. Your letter should outline educational reasons that you feel are important to your child's school achievement, not teacher preference. We cannot stress enough that this is not a "request" process.

There are situations where it will not be possible to incorporate all suggestions because of the many factors involved in building the best possible educational experience for all students.



Considerations when we build classes are among the following: peer relationships, the child's social, emotional, and physical needs, balancing behavior, providing challenge and remedial opportunities, multi-age groupings, and creating the most advantageous educational setting possible for all students.

We would like to emphasize that parents' input is respected and incorporated whenever it is organizationally and educationally feasible, but that it is not always possible to fulfill requests. We will begin class building during the next few weeks,

but all lists must be considered temporary and confidential until the first week of September, when we can confirm numbers and staffing.

If you have any questions, please do not hesitate to contact Mr. McCoy. Your input should be discussed with your child's teacher or given to Mr. McCoy by **Friday May 3rd.**
