Grade 5 District Transfer Process—February 10 to 13

Forms must be returned to the Braefoot office by 3:30 pm on Thursday, February 13th.

Important points that you should note about student transfer:

- A) If you would like a form sent home with your student during the week of February 10-13, please email the office at braefoot@sd61.bc.ca.
- *B)* If your desired destination school has space issues, **the choice will be made by lottery**. It is not first come, first served.

- **D)** If you do not have your child's PEN, the office will enter that for you.



ATTENTION GRADE 5 PARENTS

Grade 5 families have been emailed a letter with information about which Middle School their child will attend next year.

The intent of the letter is to:

- 1. Share with families the revised priorities at levelled transitions.
- 2. Communicate where their student will be registered at middle school according to their catchment area.

- 4. Provide information regarding transfer opportunities.

This is a reminder that Grade 5 students no longer "automatically" follow a pathway, and they will be registered at their catchment schools. The K-12 Student Transfer Process is **Monday, February 10—Thurs, February 13 at 3:30 pm.** Please ensure the school office has your correct address. If your address has changed since you signed the verification form which was sent out in September, please let us know asap. The District now requires that you include proof of address. SD61 Cold and Flu Season Reminders

Dear families,

We have reached that time of the year again! It is cold and flu season. As students return to classrooms for the new school year, as the leaves start to turn and the temperature drops, the tissues and sneezes begin to appear. Additionally, with COVID-19 circulating within our community, it is important to take extra precautions.

Please remind your child of the following important habits:

- Make sure to wash hands frequently.
- Avoid touching face, mouth, or eyes.
- Cover your mouth and nose when sneezing or coughing by leaning into your elbow or using a disposable tissue. Quickly throw away any used tissues and wash or sanitize your hands after.
- Respect the personal space bubbles of other students.
- Stay home when sick!

Please monitor your children daily for any cold or flu-like symptoms. In accordance with the Public Health Guidelines, students and staff are asked to stay home when sick or displaying any symptoms of sickness. If students develop symptoms throughout the day while they are at school, they will be reminded to use tissues or lean into their elbow to cover their coughs and sneezes. If required, an office staff member will contact you to arrange a pickup of your sick child. These protocols are in place to lower the risk of transmission of communicable disease and to keep our students and staff safe and healthy.

Inclement Weather Notifications

During an emergency, inclement weather, power outage, or other similar incident, it is a priority of the Greater Victoria School District 61 to communicate effectively to parents, students, and community partners. School District 61 works closely with local municipalities and emergency services to gather accurate information about road conditions and safety considerations.

The District will work quickly to determine impacts to school so parents can adjust plans accordingly in the early morning hours. We make every effort to determine school closures due to inclement weather by 6:30 am.

Dressing for the Weather



The wet, sometimes snowy, west coast winter weather is still upon us. It is therefore important that students are dressed appropriately for these conditions. We appreciate your continued support in ensuring your child arrives at school on rainy/snowy days with warm, water resistant/waterproof clothing: toque, mittens or gloves, a jacket/poncho (preferably with a hood) and closed shoes (rain/snow boots, if possible). Our students do go out for recess, exercise activities, and neighborhood walks. Some field trips also involve students being outdoors for extended periods of time, even when the weather is wet, snowy and windy.

We have had many children come to the office looking for dry clothing from our spare clothing cupboard. Our clothing cupboard has a limited amount of clothes.
