- Below is information on how to book your conference online. You may book or cancel up to 24 hours before the conference.
- Please follow the steps below to make sure your conference gets booked correctly.
- If you have any questions, please contact the office at braden.com or your child's teacher.

How to book your Parent Teacher Conference time online:

- 1. To book your parent teacher conference, please copy and paste this link: https://outlook.office365.com/owa/calendar/BraefootElementarySchool@gvsd61.onmicrosoft.com/bookings/
- 2. Select the date from the calendar for your conference (October 21 or October 22)
- 3. Select your child's classroom teacher (**This is not optional** we are unable to change the title the program gave to the section but you must select a teacher to book correctly)
- 4. Select an available conference time for that day with your child's teacher
- 5. Fill in your name, your email address, phone number and your child's name as required
- 6. Check the reminder box that you have selected the correct teacher for your conference
- 7. Click the Book button to complete the process
- 8. You will receive a confirmation email confirming your conference time and a reminder the day before

You will need to repeat these steps for each of your children

At Braefoot School, we encourage and welcome our students to dress up at school for Hallowe'en Day on Friday, October 31st. Many classes have special celebrations and events to mark the day.

Costumes should **not** include a full face covering. We also ask parents to ensure that all costumes are culturally appropriate. Any item that represents a weapon is not to be brought to school under any circumstances. Excessively violent costumes are also to be avoided at school.

Suggested items:

- Snack granola bar, Power Bar, Fruit bar, small amount of candy (nut free please).
- A letter of comfort from parents/guardians... maybe a special grandparent, aunt or uncle too.
- Family photo.
- Small comfort toy (teddy, pack of cards, favorite team sports card) just something to make them smile.

Please be advised that the school has a good supply of food, water and emergency blankets thanks to the ongoing support of the Braefoot Elementary PAC.

Remembrance Day Slide Show




This year we are putting together a slide show for our Remembrance Day assembly and are asking families to submit pictures of their loved ones (friends or

SESSION DATES AND TIMES 2025-2026

SIBKIDS: 10:30am - 2:30pm one Saturday of each month October to May \$12-drop-in/\$90-annual (8 sessions)*

SIBTEENS : 5:00 - 8:00 pm one Wednesday of each month October to May Each session includes a meal! \$10- drop-in/\$75 annual (8 sessions)*

SIBKIDS (ages 7-11)

SibKids is: talking, playing, creating, moving, sharing and snacking (!) with peers in a safe space, along with trained leaders.

SibKids is hanging out with other kids who just "get" you and why parts of your life are different because your sibling needs extra support.

SibKids is being okay with all kinds of emotions and experiences.

Participants can attend one, some, or all sessions for the year, but **must pre-register.**

SIBTEENS (ages 12-15)

At SIBTEENS we commit to create a safe space for youth to explore and discover more about themselves and their families. Group participants will engage in discussion, creative endeavors and adventurous activities. They will prepare and eat a meal together each month. All of us can learn from each others' lived experience as special siblings... both the highs and the lows.

SIBTEENS is a place for youth to know and feel that they are not alone.

Guest speakers and special activities may be offered as group members are invited to direct the group's activities and focus throughout the year.
