# REGISTRATION FOR THE 2025-2026 SCHOOL YEAR

All registration is an online. Please refer to the following link <https://www.sd61.bc.ca/registration/> that details all documents that are required and how the online process will work for registration. Click on one of the apps that meet your needs.

## Kindergarten Registration App—**OPEN JAN 26 to JAN 30**



Use this app to complete a registration/transfer request for your child entering English Kindergarten. Registration is currently closed. **Kindergarten Registration/Transfer Week is January 26 to 30, 2026.** Use this app to register your child if they were born in 2021.

## Late French Immersion—**OPEN JAN 26—JAN 30**



Any student entering Grade 6 can enroll in Late French Immersion in the Greater Victoria School District. Registration for Late French Immersion will occur during the week of January 26 - 30, 2026. Late French Immersion is offered at four dual-track middle schools: Arbutus Global, Central, Lansdowne and Shoreline. No prior knowledge of French is expected or required. If your child is interested in registering for Late French Immersion, please visit our [Late French Immersion page](#) for more information about the program, and how to register to be a part of it. Please be sure to watch the five minute video introduction to Late French Immersion and explore the "Frequently Asked Questions" section.

To register for the grade 6 Late French Immersion Program, please use this app. This app will go live on the morning of **January 26 and will be open until 3:00 pm on January 30, 2026.** All student placements will be based on district student enrollment priorities. For schools where there are fewer spaces than the number of applicants, a lottery will take place in accordance with student enrollment priorities. If you are wanting your child to attend the Late French Immersion Program, and you are willing for your child to attend a school other than your catchment school, please indicate which of the alternate schools your child would attend.



## Anytime K-12 Registration App -**Always Open for registration for current school year only**

Use this app to register a student who is new to the Greater Victoria School District for the **current** school year (2025-26).

## KINDERGARTEN REGISTRATION INFORMATION

*Dear Parents of children born in 2021,*

We are quickly approaching Kindergarten registration time in the Greater Victoria School District. Please visit our website: <https://www.sd61.bc.ca/registration/kindergarten-registration/> to find more information about registering your child.

Your first step is to identify your school catchment by using the school locator (found on the website above). Early French Immersion registration (for Kindergarten or Grade 1) is January 13-17 and English Kindergarten registration is January 26—January 30. All required documents needed for the online registration are found here: <https://www.sd61.bc.ca/registration/documentation/>

- **English Kindergarten**

Registration opens online at 8:00 am on January 26, 2026 and closes on January 30, 2026.

- **Early French Immersion** (Kindergarten & Grade 1)

Registration opens online at 8:00 am on January 12, 2026 and closes on January 16, 2026. This is a registration week for K and Grade 1 French Immersion. All placements are done automatically by our catchment priorities by lottery selection. No need for rush or panic.

Only three priorities should apply (*catchment area sibling, catchment area child, non-school district child*) because we are asking families to register at their French Immersion catchment school.

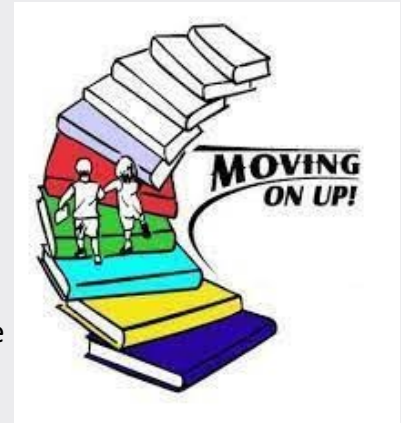

## Preparing for Grade 5 Transition to Middle School

- If you have a student in Grade 5 at Braefoot, **could you please ensure the school office has your most up-to-date address.**
- If your address has changed since you signed the student verification form in September, please notify the school of your new address, along with the required supporting documents.
- Grade 5 students do not “automatically” follow a pathway, and they will be registered at their catchment school according to the address currently on file at the school.



Grade 5 families should have received a letter on Wed. Jan 7. regarding the catchment middle school their child will be registered at and information on the option to apply for a transfer.

## Grade 5 District Transfer Process

**February 9 to 12, 2026**

Important points that you should note about student transfers:

- A) If you would like a form sent home with your student during the week of February 9-12, please email the office at [braefoot@sd61.bc.ca](mailto:braefoot@sd61.bc.ca). Forms will **only** be accepted during this week.
- B) If your desired destination school has space issues, **the choice will be made by lottery**. It is not first come, first served. There is no advantage to getting your form in first.
- C) More information about the District Transfer Process is available on the School District 61 website at <https://www.sd61.bc.ca/registration/student-transfer-process/>. Transfer forms are available to print on this page.

\*Please note: The transfer forms are not available until Monday, February 9th.

**Transfer forms must be returned to the Braefoot office by 3:00 pm on Thursday, February 12th.**

# Inclement Weather Notifications

During an emergency, inclement weather, power outage, or other similar incident, it is a priority to communicate effectively to parents, students, and community partners. We work closely with local municipalities and emergency services to gather accurate information about road conditions and safety considerations.



The school district will work quickly to determine impacts to school so parents can adjust plans accordingly in the early morning hours. **The school district makes every effort to determine school closures due to inclement weather by 6:30 am.**

## Early Dismissal Due to Inclement Weather

### Closure During School Hours

If weather conditions change throughout the day and create a concern for safety, a decision to close a school may be made in collaboration with the school principal and Superintendent. While every effort will be made to keep schools open, parents are encouraged to establish a plan for their children in the event of an early dismissal. Closure announcements will be made by the aforementioned methods.

- **Elementary and middle schools** – Staff will contact parents and/or emergency contacts. Students may only leave with their parent or caregiver.

## Reminder

**Please note: we are an all-weather recess school.** This means that unless there is an inclement weather event, all students are expected to go outside for our two recess times.

**Please dress your children appropriately for the weather of the day.**
